

New partnership formed in China

The Society of Professional Engineers (SPE) recently visited Guangzhou University in the People's Republic of China. After discussions with the University and Flaming 21 Ltd, a training company located in Hong Kong, a partnership was formed. This partnership has lead to the accreditation of top-up degrees with the university.

The SPE, working with Flaming 21 Limited, has formalised a training programme which will facilitate the delivery, monitoring and accreditation of postgraduate diplomas in construction management and contract administration.

The postgraduate diploma combines a mixture of assessed work, formal examination and interviews. Candidates successful in the process may progress to membership of the Society. The partnership with Flaming 21 Limited and Guangzhou University is a positive development reinforcing the activities of the Society and its global involvement.
